The European Film Academy announces nominations in the categories European Short and Animated Feature Film

Today the European Film Academy revealed the nominees of the categories "European Animated Feature Film" and "European Short Film". The committee which decided on the nominations for European Animated Feature Film was comprised of representatives of the European Film Academy and CARTOON, the European Association for Animation Film. The nomination committees will be presented on www.europeanfilmawards.eu after the publication of the nominations.

The category "European Short Film" is organised by the European Film Academy in co-operation with a series of film festivals across Europe. At each of these festivals, an independent jury presented one of the European short films in competition with a candidacy. Out of the complete <u>list of 29 candidates</u>, the participating festivals nominated five films for the European Film Awards. The 4,600 members of the European Film Academy will vote for the overall winners.


